Biology Challenge

About the competition

Biology Challenge stimulates students' curiosity for the natural world and encourages them to take an interest in biology outside of school. Questions will be set on the school curriculum, but the competition will also reward those students whose knowledge of the subject has been increased by reading books and magazines, watching natural history programmes, taking notice of the news media for items of biological interest, and are generally aware of our natural flora and fauna

Biology Challenge 2020 will take place between 10th - 31st March 2020. The competition consists of two, 25-minute online tests. These are taken in schools under staff-supervised exam conditions at any time convenient during the competition dates.

The Biology Challenge is organised by the UK Biology Competitions committee and administered by the Royal Society of Biology.

Prizes

Top scoring students are rewarded with publicly recognised certificates, and will be offered the opportunity to attend an awards ceremony at IET: London, Savoy Place.

Every student who takes part in the competition is eligible to receive free BioNet membership for one year

Teachers can now register their students for the Biology Challenge 2020.


The competition is open to students in:

Terms


Only members of staff at a school may register their students to take part in our school competitions; students may not self-register. By completing your school's registration you confirm that:

- 1. you are authorised to register your school to take part
- 2. you agree to ensure payment of any fees required (summarised below) in advance of the competition.
- 3. you understand that non-payment of fees will prevent your school's students taking part in further competitions
- 4. you have formally arranged parental consent for the participation of any pupils below the age of 13.

Schools with existing competition payment arrears will NOT be able to participate in the Biology Challenge 2020.



Once you have logged in, you will be able to start your registration.




Select and confirm your school from the list.
